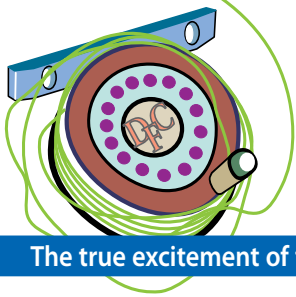

Learn to Fly Fish with Desert Fly Casters

New On-The-Water Mentor Program

Be it trout, bass, pike, carp, etc., learning to fly fish Arizona's lakes and small streams on your own can be difficult and intimidating. Furthermore, it's not always practical to host large group clinics on water that can't handle that kind of pressure.

So what's the solution?

Desert Fly Casters is proud to introduce our new "On-The-Water Mentor Program." Our objective is to teach beginning fly anglers how to successfully read and fish various types of waters for a wide array of fish species. Skilled anglers will voluntarily accompany 1 or 2 people for a half or full-day of fly fishing to one of our local or regional lakes or streams.

Just to be clear, we aren't running a guide service. Trips will be arranged around the instructor's availability. Additionally, both parties should expect to

catch fish and split travel expenses. Remember, courteous fishing partners are more likely to get repeat invitations. Therefore, it is imperative that student anglers be reasonably self-reliant—they should have their own equipment, be able to tie on their own flies, and execute a pick-up and lay-down cast. If you still need help learning these basic skills, the club offers several classes and clinics right here in the valley that you are encouraged to attend beforehand.

NOTE FROM JOE STALLER... *Be in the know...Obey the Rules:*

Wanted to let our DFC members know that AZG&F is beginning to enforce the existing rules that all PADDLE OR OAR driven watercraft must have at least one U.S. Coast Guard approved personal flotation device (PFD), type I, II, III, or V, for each person on board. Such devices must be in good and serviceable condition, readily accessible and must fit the intended wearer.

If there are no oars on board, a PFD is NOT required (although it is still an excellent idea to have one with you.)

It was also recently clarified by Fish and Game that the typical inflatable type V PFD that many of us use are only approved IF THEY ARE WORN.

The White Mountain and San Carlos Apache tribes also have similar requirements, and have been enforcing them for a few years. I got stopped on the San Carlos reservation last year for this infraction, although I just got a warning.

In my own case, I have a mesh bag where I store my fins, booties and waders-I now keep my PFD in the same bag so that it is not forgotten at home.

For June plan on tying Ginger Quill Dry Fly and Bead Head Prince Nymph from the FFI Silver award handbook



Ginger Quill - Dry Fly

Hook: Mustad 94840 or TMC 100, Size 12 or 14
Thread: Yellow 8/0 UNI-Thread or UTC 70 Denier
Wing: Natural Grey Mallard Wing Quills
Tail: Ginger hackle fibers
Body: Peacock herl stem, stripped
Hackle: Ginger Neck Hackle



Bead Head Prince Nymph

Hook: Nymph Hook, Dai-Riki 060, size 12 • **Thread:** Black 6/0 or 8/0
Bead: Gold bead sized for hook (for size 12, 2.8 to 3 mm)
Tail: Brown biots
Rib: Fine gold oval or small gold flat tinsel • **Body:** Peacock herl
Hackle: Fairly rigid brown hen or softer rooster hackle
Wing: White biots

Seneca Lake Outing...*Added notes from Joe Staller*

Outing Site: Seneca Lake

Date: Saturday, August 12, 2017

Directions: The lake is on the San Carlos Indian Reservation off HWY 60 just before the Salt River Canyon. From the valley, head east on US 60. Drive through Globe, and turn left on US 60/77 just past the McDonalds. After approximately 32 miles, the Lake will be on your left, just before you start your descent into the Salt River Canyon. It is poorly signed—we saw one sign on the right ~1/2 mile before the turnoff. After the turnoff, bear somewhat to the left, we will meet at the one concrete launch ramp. (There is a maze of roads back there. See the map. DON'T FORGET TO BUY YOUR PERMITS WHILE IN GLOBE.)

Fish: Trout, bass, sunfish.

Fishing strategy: The most effective approach would be to fish from a kick boat or float tube.

Tackle:

Rod Wt(s)	3 wt-6 wt
Line	floating, intermediate, sinking
Leader	9 ft., 4-5X
Tippet	4-5X
Other	

Hook sizes: Your favorite bass, trout and sunfish patterns should work. Wooly buggers, leeches, hare's ears, pheasant tails, and small rubber leg patterns should all work. Throw in some Clousers or other streamers for the bass, and you should have it covered.

Other gear: Waders • Sunscreen Float Tube • Pontoon Boat • Fins • Personal Flotation Device
Polarized sunglasses • Lunch, snacks, drinks

Comments: You need to have a San Carlos fishing permit and an annual habitat stamp—both are available in Globe at the Circle K, on the left JUST AFTER the turn to the Salt River Canyon. (Meaning that you go past the turn to the Salt River Canyon, buy your permit at the circle K, then head back towards Globe until you see the Salt River turn off, now on your right.) It is also possible that they are available at Sportsmans on Greenfield road, but I have NOT confirmed that. The day use permit is \$10, and the annual habitat stamp is \$6.

Looking back at the outing to Seneca in April 2016, Clear or camo intermediate lines were the preferred fly lines. The best fly seemed to be bead-head sparkle buggers in various colors. (Joe's "Little Man" in chartreuse worked well also.) Cast towards the cattails (they completely line the lake) give it a 10 second sink time, and start an erratic, slow, retrieve. Although a few bass were caught, the rest of the fish were oversized bluegill, green sunfish, and shell crackers. Rod Buchanan landed a bluegill that was easily over one pound!
